Enable us to eliminate poverty, prejudice, and oppression, that peace may prevail with righteousness, and justice with order, and that men and women from different cultures and with differing talents may find with one another the fulfillment of their humanity. *Amen.*

### **A PRAYER ATTRIBUTED TO ST. FRANCIS**

to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit,  
be honor and glory throughout all ages. *Amen.*
