Marching Toward the Passion

“As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he will come to us like the winter rains,
like the spring rains that water the earth.” (Hosea 6:3)

Dear St. Timothy's 'Ohana,

As we approach mid-March, we draw ever closer to Holy Week and the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. It also marks a full year that we, as a congregation, have lived in a time of pandemic.

During this past year, we have grieved the changes that have taken place in our common life. Though necessary for the health and benefit of fellow parishioners, our families, and friends, we have altered how we gathered, prayed, and worshiped. For me, it felt like we were living in a year-long winter. In this edition of the Ka Leo, there is a general outline of my address from the annual meeting showing the situations and the responses to the challenges of the past year and is divided into three distinct categories: Social, Economic, and Spiritual. By God's grace, and perhaps some sheer grit, we responded to the challenges we faced along the way. The promise of 2021 awaits us.

To borrow from Shakespeare, now that the “winter of our discontent” is “made glorious summer” by the presence of COVID-19 vaccines, we continue to live in the hope that we will return to earlier times of freedom. Back in April of 2020, while under lockdown, we said that when the pandemic is over, we will celebrate Easter together once again. I still believe that to be true. Even so, it not yet time to throw away our masks. Still, we are marching steadily to the Passion.


The Passion of our Lord is the story of Jesus' betrayal, arrest, conviction, execution, and burial. A tragic story that ends with a broken Christ, wrapped in a burial shroud. Why can't we go from Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday with shouts of “Hosanna in the Highest” to Easter shouts of “Alleluia?” I suppose we could just skip the events of Holy Week and get to “the good stuff” of Easter. It would be easier. But then, I think the empty tomb would be just be a big hole. Truthfully, without the Passion, the miracle of Easter Day makes little sense. What God does on Easter morning must be put up against the horrors of the crucifixion. In the crucifixion it looks as though evil and death win. The miracle, however, is that death does not have the final say.

It doesn't matter if we are still in a pandemic. The world still turns, and Jesus will once again enter Jerusalem. All the events of Holy Week will still happen and need to happen: the shouts of “Hosanna” and a carpet of palms; the invitation by Christ to gather around the table at his Last Supper and his new commandment to “Love one another, as I have loved you;” the kiss of betrayal, the arrest, and the trial of Jesus; the crowd and us at Golgotha with the shouts of, “Crucify him!” echoing in our ears as Jesus is raised up on the cross; the cry of his final breath; and the stone being sealed against the tomb.

It doesn't matter if we are still in a pandemic. Easter morning will come soon enough. Hope and joy will be our strength and shouts of “Alleluia” will echo from the roof tops once more as we run to see the empty tomb. It's no longer a just a “big hole,” it is evidence of a living God whose triumph over evil, darkness, and death means that winter will turn to spring, love has triumphed, and life will find a way.






COVID VACCINATION SURVEY- 18 Responses

Have you already received a COVID Vaccine (either the first or second shot)? 18 responses


